## **A Letter From Bishop John R. Schol**

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

What a great joy and honor it is to serve as a leader in the United Methodist Church. You, who have been called, ordained, elected, commissioned, licensed and blessed to serve as pastor, lay leader, chairperson or committee member, make up a vast network of leaders throughout the Baltimore-Washington Conference. You serve in the local church, in your community, and at the conference level. In all, we have more than 15,000 leaders, like you, seeking to be like Christ as you lead spiritually by calling, equipping, sending and supporting disciples to make new disciples and grow Acts 2 congregations for the transformation of the world.

We look forward as conference staff in serving you and I am glad to have this opportunity to share with you as key leaders within the life of the Baltimore-Washington Conference. We are making healthy progress here in the Baltimore-Washington Conference, growing on biblical imperatives, following a vision/mission that is guiding our commitments and actions, and using best practices.

Our leadership grows out of a firm scriptural base that supports and challenges us in how we serve as spiritual leaders. Here in the Baltimore-Washington Conference, we have four key biblical imperatives that invite us to be a great conference made up of life-changing congregations and ministries.

1. The Great Commandment/Disciple

Matthew 22:37-39

Great Disciples love God completely and love their neighbor as themselves.

2. The Great Church

Acts 2

Great Churches are filled and led by the Spirit, welcome all people, and engage in holistic ministry of worship, fellowship, faith development, service and faith sharing. These congregations bear fruit.

3. The Great Leader

Ephesians 4:11-12

Great Leaders recognize their giftedness from God and use their gift to build up the congregation for ministry in the world.

4. The Great Commission/Mission

Matthew 28:19

The Great Mission for congregations and disciples is to make new disciples and engage all disciples in the transformation of the world.

Here is one example of our acting on these biblical imperatives.

In New Mexico, there is a Navajo reservation located on a uranium mine. For a number of years, Navajo men have been working in the uranium mine. These men, along with others who live near the mine, have a high incidence of cancer. Recently 20 Navajo women who lost their husbands to cancer traveled to Washington, DC to meet with legislators so that something would be done to address the issue. Some of the women had never been far from the reservation.

When we learned from a United Methodist pastor who serves on the reservation that this group was coming, Sandy Ferguson, our mission/social justice coordinator, organized a time to meet and pray with the women at our DC office and to help them navigate the halls of power. Also, Rev. Kay Albury and her church members of Asbury Town Neck provided transportation and hosted the women during their stay in our conference. It was a deeply moving experience to hear their story and to experience their deep gratitude to the Baltimore-Washington Conference. It was the Great Disciple, Leader, Church and Mission of the Baltimore-Washington Conference in action.

How is your leadership embodying these biblical imperatives? What is your church doing to be live these passages?

This past Sunday, I celebrated World Wide Communion with Franklin Church in Southern Maryland. Their congregation has been exploring these passages in worship and committee meetings as they engage in the Discipleship Adventure. Through these conversations they have made commitments on how to serve and over the past several years they are bearing Acts 2 fruit.

As bishop and conference staff, we are here to support you in leading within the congregation, community and conference. We will continue to pray for you, develop training to equip and support you for spiritual leadership and be available to work with your congregation. If you would like support or training for your congregation, through your church council or pastor, request that one of our staff adventure guides come and meet with your congregation. This fall, you will have a chance to meet with your adventure guide at your charge conference. I invite you to engage in conversation with your guide about the biblical imperatives and how they are working through you to help transform your church and community.

Thank you for serving and striving to be a great spiritual leader. You are part of a great movement that is making a difference.

## New Boiler On The Way

On Sunday, September 13th, a special Church Council meeting was held to consider the Trustees' recommendation for a new boiler. The recommendation was unanimously approved and work has begun. We have \$15,300 on hand designated for this project, but will have to borrow the remainder of the funds from ourselves, depleting our investments until the money can be replaced. The total cost of the project is \$73,000. The new system will be much more efficient than the existing system, and we will realize savings in our utility bills immediately. Please consider a special gift to this project. Finances are a challenge for many of us at this time, but anything we can collect now will reduce our depletion of current resources, as well as reducing the amount we need to replace. **Please mark all contributions "Boiler Fund."** We give thanks for the generosity of Jean Fraunfelter, who left LRUMC \$10,000. We received this bequest just as this critical need surfaced, and our coming warmth will be part of Jean's legacy.

Dr. Barclay M. Newman, Senior Translation Officer (retired) for the American Bible Society, was Chair of the Contemporary English Version (CEV) of the Bible in 1995. Previously he was a United Bible Societies Translation Consultant in the Far East for 20 years. He established the Department of Translation at the University of Malaysia. He has written extensively on issues of translation. Dr. Newman has a PhD from Southern Seminary and graduate studies at Hebrew Union, Cincinnati, the Hartford Seminary Foundation and others.
