7:30 – 9 p.m.

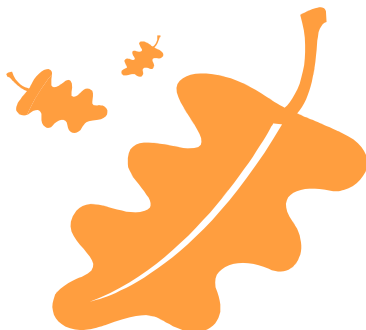

New Boiler/Upgraded Heat System Approved

On the evening of September 13, the Church Council met in a special meeting called by Council Chair Rhoda Wilson to consider the proposal brought by the Board of Trustees to replace the boiler and upgrade our heating system. This is a project which has been on the back burner for some time. It has become urgent now, in that our present system is not working at the moment, and the necessary repair would be very costly without addressing any efficiency issues.

Twenty-eight LRUMC members attended the meeting. Trustees President David Brown introduced Jim Blake from A.J. Michaels, the company which presented the proposal identified by the trustees as best suiting our needs. Mr. Blake fielded a wide range of questions, both technical and practical.

A motion was made, and unanimously approved, to go ahead with the project, beginning work as soon as possible so that we will have working and efficient heat when the cold weather comes.

The total cost of the project to replace the original heating system of the church with a new and efficient system is \$73,000.

It's a big undertaking with the economic reality of our time, but we really **MUST** do this. At this writing, the heating system is not operational, and even repaired, it continues to burn an extravagant amount of fuel. Our winter fuel bills can, and often do, exceed \$5000 for one month. A conservative estimate is that the new system will yield a savings of 25% or more from the first day of operation.

\$5300 has been put aside over the years toward this project. In addition, our dear Jean Fraunfelter, a charter member of this congregation, generously remembered LRUMC in her will and her family has agreed that she would want her \$10,000 gift to be used toward this critical need. That means we have \$15,300 in hand. The finance committee, understanding the urgency of the need, has authorized the borrowing of whatever funds we can't collect from donations from our investments, but we will need to pay it back as soon as possible.

We need the help of all who are able to help with this. Specifically, we need to collect as much as folks

are able to give right now to reduce the amount we need to borrow. Then we'll need folks to continue to give, as they are blessed, until we restore the funds taken from investment accounts.

We know this is a hard time for many, and our congregation has been incredibly faithful in giving in these times, both for our operating budget and for special collections for mission to those in need. Please prayerfully consider responding once again. All donations should be marked "boiler fund". We offer a big round of thanks to the trustees for all their work on this, and we are grateful for all you do in Christ's name. Thank you and God bless you.
